- 3 The above standalone unaudited financial results for the quarter and six month period ended 30 September 2021 have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles of Indian Accounting Standard 34, Interim Financial Reporting (Ind AS 34'), prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and are in compliance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of Regulation 33 the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended). The Audit Committee has reviewed these standalone financial results and the Board of Directors have approved the same, in their respective meetings held on 11 November 2021.
- 4 The Management and the Board of Directors have assessed the possible effects of COVID-19 pandemic on the Company's liquidity position for the next financial year and the carrying values of Company's assets as at 30 September 2021, and has concluded that no material adjustments are required to these standalone financial results. The impact assessment of COVID-19 is an ongoing process and the Company will continue to monitor any material changes to future economic conditions, as and when they arise.
- 5 Exceptional item for the quarter and six month period ended 30 September 2020 and year ended 31 March 2021 represent other financial assets written off on account of settlement with a customer.
- The Company is primarily engaged into business of providing services in Energy sector including oilfield services. The Chief Operating Decision Maker (CODM) reviews the Company's performance as a single business segment. There being only one segment, separate disclosure for segment is not applicable.
- 7 Other expenses includes the expenditure incurred towards travel and conveyance, security expenses and legal and professional charges for the projects undertaken by the Company.
- 8 Other income for the quarter and six month period ended 30 September 2021, and year ended 31 March 2021 includes dividend income of INR 1,112.78 lakhs and INR 748.00 lakhs respectively, received from one of the wholly owned subsidiaries.
- 9 Pursuant to the exercise of employee stock options under Asian Oilfield Service Limited Employee Stock Option Plan 2019, the Company has allotted 320,186 equity shares of face value INR 10 each at a premium of INR 70 per share, during the quarter ended 30 September 2021.

- 4. With respect to matters stated in Note 6(a) and Note 6(b) to the accompanying Statement, the following qualifications have been included in the auditor's review report dated 31 October 2021 on the interim financial statements of Asian Oilfield & Energy Service DMCC (ADMCC), a subsidiary of the Holding Company, issued by an independent firm registered in Dubai, United Arab Emirates and reproduced by us as under:
 - (a) "Accounts receivable & amount due from customer for contract works amounting to USD 7,924,254/& USD 76,161/- respectively remain unconfirmed as at reporting date from one customer
 M/s Amni International Petroleum Development OML 52 Company Limited, who had issued a notice
 of suspension of the contract on November 16, 2020. Against the said notice from customer, the
 Company has issued notice of termination vide notice no. 2021-AOS-AMN-P002-0017 dated August
 3, 2021 to terminate the contract with immediate effect based on contractual terms. Subsequently,
 without prejudice, the Company has issued notice of suspension of the termination till August 31, 2021
 (moratorium period) vide notice no. 2021-AOS-AMN-P002-0018 dated August 7, 2021 to amicably
 solve the matter which has been further extended till October 31, 2021 via email dated
 October 1, 2021. Accounts receivable & amount due from customer for contract work are subject to
 impairment testing and the net profit, account receivable & amount due from customer for contract
 work and net worth would be overstated to the extent of impairment, if any."

Our audit report dated 19 June 2021 and review report dated 14 August 2021, on the consolidated financial results for the year ended 31 March 2021 and quarter ended 30 June 2021 respectively, were also qualified in respect of this matter.

(b) "Accounts payable amounting to USD 5,004,896/- are subject to confirmation."

Our review report dated 14 August 2021, on the consolidated financial results for the quarter ended 30 June 2021 was also qualified in respect of this matter.

- 5. Based on our review conducted and procedures performed as stated in paragraph 3 above and upon consideration of the review reports of other auditors referred to in paragraph 7 below, except for the possible effects of the matters described in previous paragraph, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying Statement, prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Ind AS 34, prescribed under Section 133 of the Act, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, has not disclosed the information required to be disclosed in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended), including the manner in which it is to be disclosed, or that it contains any material misstatement.
- 6. We draw attention to Note 7 to the accompanying Statement, which describes the impact of COVID-19 pandemic on the Holding Company's operations. In view of the uncertainties in the economic environment due to the outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic, the impact on the financial position and performance of the Holding Company is dependent on the future developments as they evolve. Our conclusion is not modified in respect of this matter.
- 7. We did not review the interim financial statements/ interim financial information of three (3) subsidiaries included in the Statement, whose financial information (before eliminating inter-company transactions and balances) reflects total assets of INR 10,471.66 lakhs as at 30 September 2021, and total revenues of INR 49.16 lakhs and INR 201.52 lakhs, total net loss after tax of INR 520.22 lakhs and INR 924.01 lakhs and total comprehensive loss of INR 520.22 lakhs and INR 924.01 lakhs, for the quarter and six month period ended on 30 September 2021, respectively, and cash outflows (net) of INR 1,255.39 lakhs for the six month period ended 30 September 2021, as considered in the Statement. These interim financial statements/ interim financial information have been reviewed by other auditors whose review reports have been furnished to us by the management, and our conclusion in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiaries is based solely on the review reports of such other auditors and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph 3 above.

- 3 The above consolidated unaudited financial results for the quarter and six month period ended 30 September 2021 have been prepared in accordance with the accounting principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standard 34, Interim Financial Reporting (Ind AS 34'), prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and are in compliance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of Regulation 33 the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended). The Audit Committee has reviewed these consolidated financial results and the Board of Directors have approved the same, in their respective meetings held on 11 November 2021.
- The above consolidated financial results includes the financial results of the Holding Company and its subsidiaries viz. Asian Oilfield & Energy Services DMCC ('ADMCC'); AOSL Petroleum Pte. Limited ('APPL'); AOSL Energy Services Limited ('AESL'); Optimum Oil & Gas Private Limited ('OOGPL') and Ivorene Oil Services Nigeria Limited (upto 17 June 2020) (together referred to as 'Group'). ADMCC and APPL are located outside India, whose financial results for the quarter and six month period ended 30 September 2021 have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in their respective countries. The Holding Company's management has converted the financial results of these subsidiaries from accounting principles generally accepted in their respective countries to accounting principles generally accepted in India.
- The Group is primarily engaged into business of providing services in Energy sector including oilfield services. The Chief Operating Decision Maker (CODM) reviews the Group's performance as a single business segment. There being only one segment, additional disclosure for segment is not applicable.
- 6(a) ADMCC's customer 'Amni International Petroleum Development OML 52 Company Limited' (AMNI) had issued notice of suspension of work effective 16 November 2020, on account of certain technical challenges faced by AMNI. Accordingly, the suspension had temporarily ceased all the work under the contract from the aforesaid date. Against the said notice from AMNI, ADMCC has issued notice of termination vide notice no. 2021-AOS-AMN-P002-0017 dated 3 August 2021 to terminate the contract with immediate effect based on contractual terms. Subsequently, without prejudice, to amicably resolve the matter, ADMCC has issued notice to AMNI regarding suspension of the termination till 31 August 2021 (moratorium period) vide notice no. 2021-AOS-AMN-P002-0018 dated 7 August 2021. Subsequently, on 09 November 2021, ADMCC has further extended the suspension of termination till 31 December 2021. Trade receivables and other current assets as at 30 September 2021 includes INR 5,884.16 lakhs (USD 7,924,254) and INR 56.55 lakhs (USD 76,161) respectively, receivable from AMNI. Based on the current stage of discussion with AMNI and considering the contractual right to receive the outstanding amount, ADMCC's management is confident of recovery of these receivables and assets and accordingly believes that no further adjustments are required in consolidated financial results.
- 6(b) There are certain trade payables amounting to INR 3,716.39 lakhs (USD 5,004,896) directly linked to the project executed with AMNI, which are subject to confirmation. As the underlying project is on standby due to notice of suspension of work effective 16 November 2020, the scope of work of these vendors has also been held in abeyance. ADMCC's management is confident that incremental dues, if any, towards these vendors arising on account of this shall not be material and accordingly no further adjustments are required in
- The Management and the Board of Directors have assessed the possible effects of COVID-19 pandemic, on the Holding Company's liquidity position for the next financial year and the carrying values of Holding Company's assets as at 30 September 2021, and has concluded that no material adjustments are required to these consolidated financial results. The impact assessment of COVID-19 is an ongoing process and the Holding Company will continue to monitor any material changes to future economic conditions, as and when they arise.
